N/A - NCCI: Economy Will Continue to Hold Down Claims Frequency
The National Council on Compensation Insurance (NCCI) is predicting that continued employment growth will hold down claims frequency in the workers' compensation market.

The Boca Raton, Fla.-based rate maker released its Economy News Release, predicting that the rate will continue to rise until the labor market is poised for a full recovery.

NCCI also predicted:

- Slow growth in weekly wages for workers will limit indemnity payments.
- Despite the economy, medical inflation is expected to continue to rise.
- Income from investments will likely be constrained based on tight money markets that will keep short-term interest rates at historic low levels.
